CLINIC SCHEDULE

9:00 am - **Registration and Get Horses Tacked Up.**

9:30 am -

Group A : “What to Expect at your pre-ride vet check” - Dr. Nick Striegel, DVM will explain the procedure and pre-ride physical evaluation of your horse. You will also learn about the Horsemanship scorecard used in competition.



Group B: “Ride Out On The Trail” - Lead by Amy Star and Donna Garnett, we will ride a segment of trail near the Urban Farm. While we are riding we will teach trail etiquette, map reading skills and techniques for negotiating obstacles. Plan on riding 4-5 miles during this session.



11:00 am - Break and Lunch provided by The Urban Farm 4-H Club

12:00pm - **“Emergency First Aid”** You will be taught basic first aide for your horse and what essential items you should carry with you on the trail.

12:45 pm - **Group A: “Ride Out On The Trail”**

Group B: “What to Expect at your pre-ride vet check”

2:15 pm - **“Rating Your Horse”** - Ride your horse over a set distance, learn how fast you have traveled by the official timer. Distance to be approximately 1 mile.

4-H Members and Parents are both welcome to participate, **EVERYONE IS REQUIRED TO WEAR A HELMET.** You need to bring your horse to this clinic if you wish to ride out on the trail or be timed for the the rating session. Auditors are welcome for a day fee of \$10.

The trail outing will cover varied terrain and obstacles including but not limited to: water crossings, logs, brush, grasses, sidewalks, farm animals, dogs, bicycles, pedestrians, cement, rocks, trees, guard rails, etc.
